I have lived all over the country: Midwest, East Coast, West Coast, and the great frozen North. In Oklahoma, we are blessed to experience four full seasons. In comparison, my experience on the West Coast was that we only had two defined seasons, summer and the rainy season, and up North, we only had winter and road construction seasons, and neither had anything significant for a spring or fall season.

I enjoy these changing seasons and the transformation our environment goes through. Spring brings new life all around us, and fall completes the cycle and sets the stage to begin anew.

It does come with challenges, though. Now we are deep into "storm" season when many of us think about preparedness for extreme weather, tornados, high wind, hail, flooding, etc. I can say unequivocally nobody likes power outages, also known as power appreciation days, especially electric utilities as they are usually driven by weather events, and therefore, happen in those times of extreme disruption.

Canadian Valley Electric Cooperative works year-round to mitigate power outages and prepare for restoration efforts. It is the core of our business. It begins with system design, considering the strengths of poles and wires' weight, the circuit breakers and lightning arrestors to protect critical equipment, and software to help identify, isolate, and contain system disruptions to the smallest footprint possible.

Our warehouse staff ensures we have sufficient poles and spare parts supplies to restore services when needed without delay. Our accounting staff trains and is prepared to track restoration efforts that may qualify for FEMA re-imbursements to reduce costs to members. Our member services team practices a "Red Alert" process that quickly gets all hands on deck to process customer phone calls and reports of damage.

Before any known incoming weather events, our line crews ensure their equipment is maintained to peak operating efficiency. That is not just bucket trucks but also chain saws, hot sticks, rubber goods, climbing gear, and everything that might be needed to restore power in callous conditions.

In addition to the physical preparation, we continually train on safety issues to ensure we can work in those harsh conditions safely for both our employees and the general public.

So I hope you are enjoying spring and looking forward to a delightful summer. You can rest easy on one point, whenever we experience an extreme weather event, we will be there in your time of need, and our entire team will be working to restore services as quickly as possible.

Energy EfficiencyTip of the Month

The location of your thermostat can impact your HVAC system's ability to maintain an ideal indoor temperature. For maximum accuracy, thermostats should be placed in the center of the home, away from air vents, plumbing pipes and exterior doors. Avoid placing items like lamps and televisions near your thermostat, which can cause the HVAC to run longer than necessary. Avoid installing thermostats in rooms that tend to feel warmer or colder than the rest of the home. Do not place furniture in front of the thermostat, which can block air flow and result in inaccurate readings.
